This term students in J suite have been exploring the places they live in and belong to. Visits from local community services and their peers from other classes have been a highlight. It is important for children to explore how they feel about different places, what makes them special, and how they can care for them. Role play, stories, maps and making connections to country were shared and explored. Special thanks to the Seaford MFS, the Community Engagement Team at Sturt Police station and Melinda from the Waste and Recycling Education Team at Onkaparinga Council.



In G2 we have been discussing the Dreaming story of Tjilbruke and the relevance of the story to our local Kurna area. We also learnt about the importance of Sorry Day and designed our own native hibiscus to show our respect for Sorry Day and Reconciliation week.

We were very fortunate to have our own SSO, Richard, bring in his didgeridoo. He discussed the importance of requesting permission before learning to play and showed us on a map where he sourced the wood to make his own didgeridoo. He explained that this was done under the guidance of an elder. He then played us a bit of a tune and helped us to identify an animal that one sound represented.

Dion Drummond



Dion is one of Australia's most experienced Indigenous performers, covering both Mainland and Islander culture as a dancer, singer and storyteller. Dion shared tales and artifacts from his cultures, teaching students about the different traditions of both Torres Strait Island and Aboriginal storytelling, song, and dance. Our students participated in his performance, and they were very engaged as he happily shared his culture and life with us at Seaford Rise Primary School.



In week 5 during Reconciliation Week the school invited Dion Drummond to perform. Dion Drummond's Aboriginal name is 'Moogera', meaning storm. He is of Torres Strait Islander descent on his mother's side, and Aboriginal from his father's side. Dion was born in Mossman (Kuku-Yalangi Tribal area), 80km north of Cairns, Queensland.

Students interested in taking part will need to fill out the expression of interest and return to the school by Monday 7th August.

There will be 3 groups

Rec- yr 2 Year 3-4 Year 5-6

Students will need to undertake an investigation and present their findings and scientific understanding to the judges.

The criteria will be based on:

accurate science content, ability to communicate and explain their ideas clearly, skill demonstrated including questioning and predicting, planning and conduction, processing and analysing their data and evaluating the result.

Students may enter as individuals or in small groups of up to 3 students.
